



From the Pastor

Since we are now a few weeks into the new year, this can be a good time to review our routines and evaluate any changes that are needed. You may still be working on your new year's resolutions, or you may have crashed and burned by now. How did you change your routine in order to allow a new change to affect you? When God invites us into change, it rarely happens when everything else stays the same. How do you encounter God in your routines? Do you encounter God in your routines? If not, there is no time like the present to begin inviting God into the daily activities of your life.

In order to do this, a practice called discernment is very helpful. There are many ways of discerning God's plan, both big and small, for our lives. My favorite resource is St. Ignatius of Loyola's discernment of spirits. The details of this practice are explained very well by Fr. Timothy Gallagher in a book called "The Discernment of Spirits." I have found this resource vital in understanding God's movements in my life. The book covers the fourteen rules of discerning God's movements in your life, but the most important are the first two. I could even say the second rule is the most important; it states that if you are not moving toward God's love and growing in holiness, none of the following rules can be used. It highlights the importance of seeking to live in God's love. If we are not doing this on a regular basis, it will be difficult to know how God is working in our lives.
