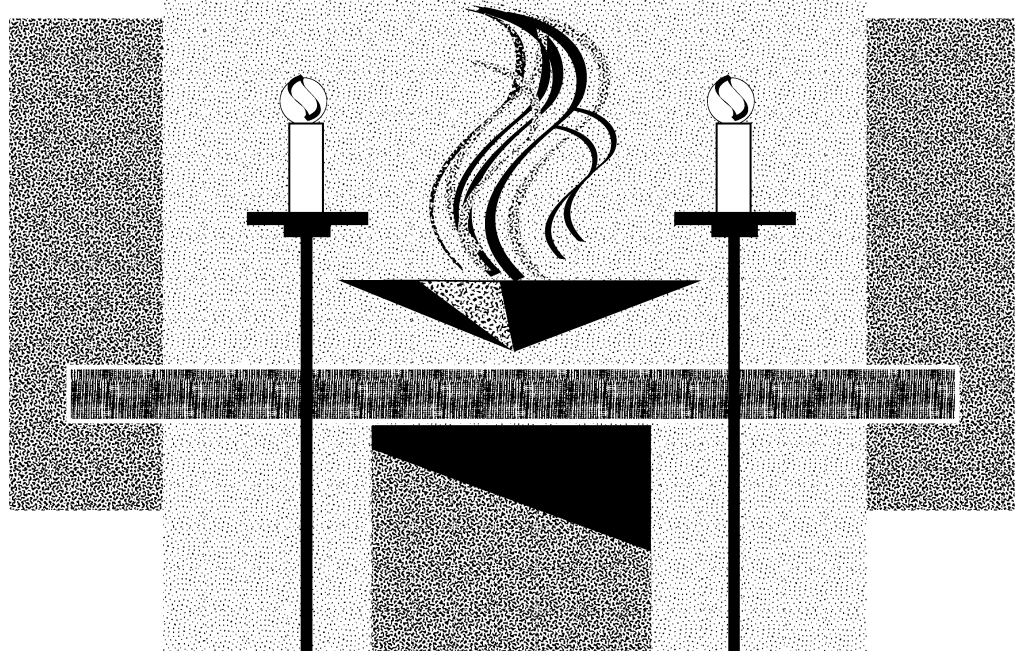

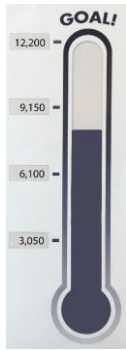

- **After Mass** - At the conclusion of Mass, we hear the phrase "Go in Peace," how can we bring God's peace to others during this time?

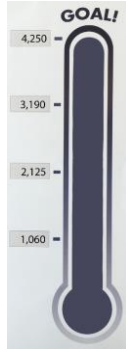
A note from Bishop Quinn:

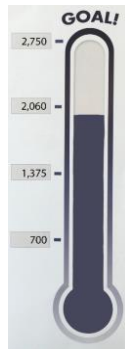

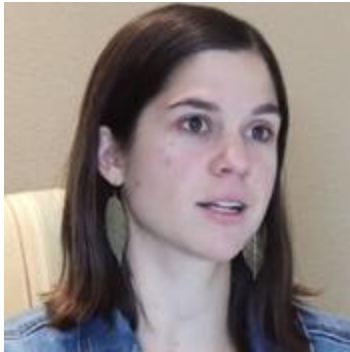

Thank you, women who work! You are present and active in every area of life-social, economic, cultural, artistic and political. In this way you make an indispensable contribution to the growth of a culture, which unites reason and feeling, to a model of life ever open to the sense of “mystery” to the establishment of economic and political structures ever more worthy of humanity.

Thank you, consecrated women! Following the example of the greatest of women, the Mother of Jesus Christ, the Incarnate Word, you open yourselves with obedience and fidelity to the gift of God's love. You help the Church and all mankind to experience a “spousal” relationship to God, on which magnificently expresses the fellowship, which God wishes to establish with his creatures.
