





From The Pastor

Holy Week is just around the corner! Hang in there with your Lenten practices. Thankfully (?), at least the weather has cooperated with a Lenten spirit by being miserable this past week! Okay, so being miserable is not the goal of Lent. Yet conversion can be painful and slow, and I hope that you have not yet given up on that process.

As we enter into Holy Week, I encourage you to enter in wholeheartedly. On Friday the 8th, we will have Stations of the Cross at 5:30pm in Church. If that time doesn't work for you, Stations booklets are available in the back of church on the gift table. Feel free to stop in during the day to pray; the church normally opens around 7:30am, and stays open until at least 6:00pm.

On Saturday the 9th, we will have a daily Mass at 8:30am, followed by Confessions from 9:00-10:00am. I realize Wednesdays don't work well for everyone, so I want to be sure to add some extra times. I will also be available after Mass on Sunday the 10th for at least 30 minutes.

Next Sunday is Palm Sunday—the only Sunday where we hear two Gospels (and get to hear two homilies! Yay!). This Sunday begins with rejoicing, but ends with sorrow. It is a great example of liturgical whiplash. The palms you receive are more than decorations for the year, or a resource for a unique arts and crafts opportunity. They represent the building blocks of Jesus' path into Jerusalem. Let them remind you of the path he has made into your soul as he lays down his life for you.

Finally (for now), the annual Chrism Mass will be celebrated on Monday, the 11th at Pax Christi parish in Rochester at 4:00pm. I realize that time doesn't work for everyone, but I strongly encourage you to attend if possible. It is at this Mass that Bishop Quinn will bless the holy oils for the upcoming year, including the Chrism that will be used to anoint the next priest of our diocese, Deacon Michael Churchill. The priests of the diocese will also renew the promises of our priestly ordination, especially the promise to care for all of you.

A blessed finish to Lent to you all!
