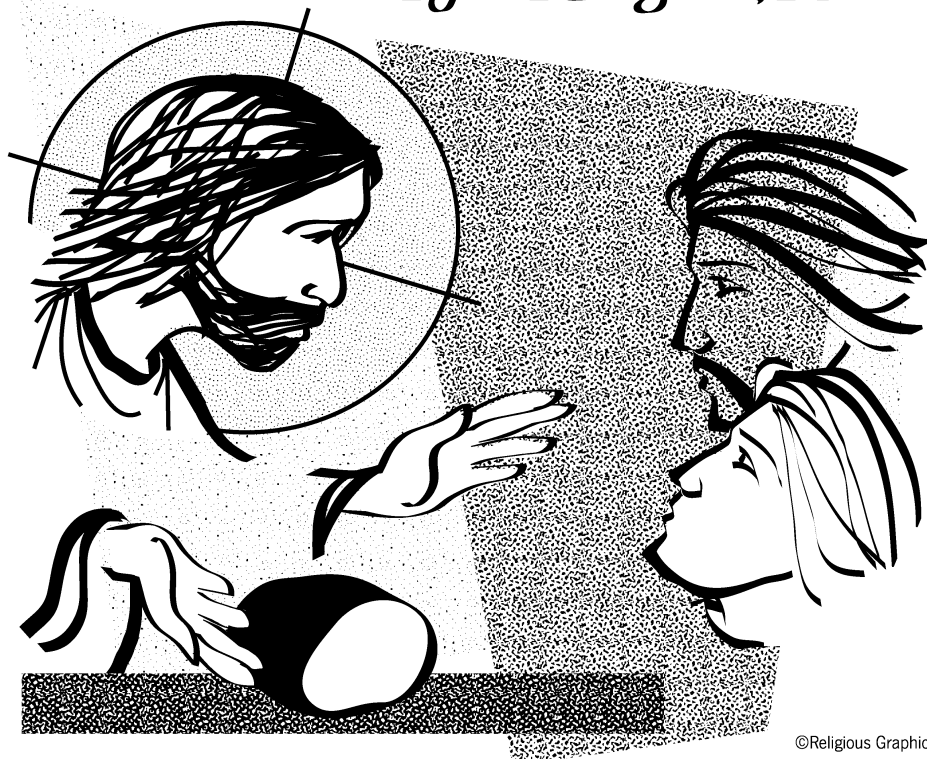

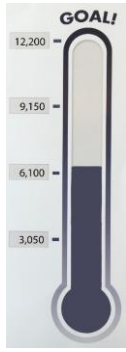

Adoration will also be suspended. **Fr. Frerichs is recording the Sunday Mass** each week at St. Rose, and it will be posted on our website, www.st-rose.org.

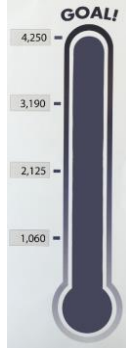

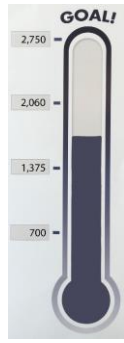

Pastor's Column

As we begin the new week, I want to express a word of appreciation for the strong and positive response from so many of you who have continued to assist with the Catholic Ministry Appeal and general parish support. As you can see, the people of St. Anthony Parish have already reached their goal and the people of both Immaculate Conception and St. Rose of Lima Parish are well on the way. Please consider giving to this important cause if you have not done so already.

On a second note, believing that transparency is always the best policy, I think that it is important to merely call our attention to the significant reduction in general support over these last several weeks. These funds are used to provide for ongoing operations. As one would expect, employee salaries, insurance, and the cost of annual contracts for various services remain unchanged throughout the current pandemic. I mention this with hesitation, knowing that many are significantly strapped during these very difficult times. As members of our parish communities, it is important for you to know that arrangements have been made to receive \$19,900 assistance through the Federal Administration's Payment Protection Program. For now, resources are being used from general savings. A word of genuine appreciation goes out to all who offer support through prayers and ongoing financial support.

Some people have been asking about First Communion, Confirmations, and other activities this spring. At this point in time leadership is asking that each parish work out the timing of parish events to the best of their abilities. More information will be made available when clearer direction is provided regarding how the resumption of public masses will be accomplished.
