## **From the Pastor**

There is no doubt that the Eucharist holds a central place in our lives as Catholics. Not only is it the highest form of worship, but it also shapes so much of our faith identity. As you think back to the period in the pandemic when we weren’t able to join together for Mass, hopefully you missed, or longed for, Communion. While many of us make the conscious decision to head to church each Sunday and receive Communion, not everyone is free to do so.

I am aware that several of our parishioners take Communion from church to the homebound. This is part of an ancient tradition whereby those unable to physically attend Mass would be spiritually joined to the community when someone visits them and allows them to receive the Eucharist. It is important to keep this practice active, to spend time in prayer with them, and to simply visit. While I am aware of certain parishioners who benefit from these visits, I am sure there are more.

If you or someone you know is unable to attend Mass and would like a Communion visit, please let me know. Also, if you are interested in visiting the homebound and bringing Communion to them, let me know. It would be good if, at least once a month, someone from the parish would visit each of our homebound parishioners. I will be happy to provide training to anyone who would like to take up this ministry.
