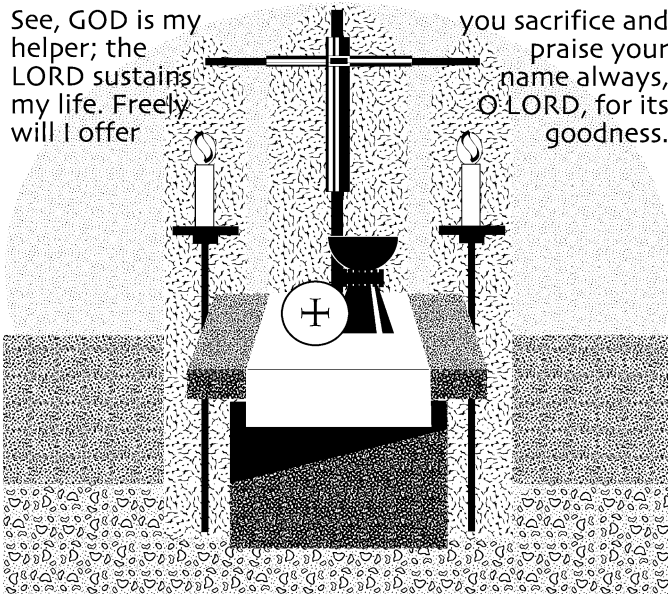

We are looking for an individual to serve as a part-time secretary for each parish of Holy Trinity, Rollingstone and/or St. Rose, Lewiston.

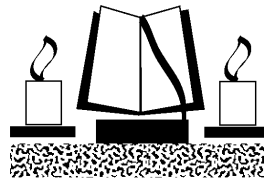
