

All people of good will are invited to take part in a day of prayer and fasting on **Thursday, September 24**, for the intentions of God's mercy on the country and the healing and conversion of our hearts, especially in light of the ongoing pandemic and civil unrest. Those who are able, especially between 18-60 years of age, are asked to fast until sundown as a sign of repentance. Eucharistic Adoration will be available from 9:00 a.m. to noon at St. Rose. Pastor's Perspective: A Few Updates

- Next week, the Church in the United States celebrates Catechetical Sunday. Here is what the USCCB says about this day:
 “In 2020, the Church will celebrate Catechetical Sunday on September 20, 2020, under the theme of ‘I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you.’ On this day, catechists are formally commissioned for ministry to the community. Catechetical Sunday is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each baptized person plays in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of faith.”
 I encourage each of you to consider the ways in which you hand on the faith. The mission of the church belongs not only to the clergy, but to all the baptized. In a special way, parents, godparents, and sponsors support others. All of us, however, are called to “go out.”
- This year, our parishes’ efforts in catechizing will look different. I do not yet know how faith formation will look, but Ashley, our Faith Formation director, is actively working with the school to understand what will be possible. Stay tuned for more information!
- Last week, we made the decision to continue with this year’s rib dinner at St. Anthony. It is likely that it will be carry out only, but that will not change the quality of the meal! I hope you will be able to make in on November 7.
